Nobilis® Gumboro



Vaccine	Nobilis° Gumboro is an inactivated vaccine against Infectious Bursal Disease (IBD)
Target Species	Chicken Breeders
Composition	Active Components: Inactivated Infectious Bursal Disease Virus (Strain IBDV D78) inducing ≥ 14.5 log ₂ VN units per dose
Formulation	Oil adjuvant emulsion
Indications	For the booster vaccination of breeders against IBDV in order to protect the offspring against Infectious Bursal Disease (IBD) virus.
Disease	In Australia the subclinical form of IBD, causing immune suppression due to damage to the Bursa of Fabricius, occurs. Increased susceptibility to other diseases, poor response to vaccinations, decreased weight gains and higher feed conversions can result.
Dosage	0.5 mL per bird
Vaccination	Replacement breeders should be vaccinated intramuscularly in the thigh or breast muscle or subcutaneously into the lower part of the neck with Gumboro vaccine at approximately 16-20 weeks of age, but not less than 4 weeks before the expected onset of lay. For optimal booster effect, the birds must be primed with live vaccine against IBD at least 6 weeks previously.
Method of Administration	Allow the vaccine to reach ambient temperature (15-25°C) before use. Shake the bottle well before and during use. Inject 0.5 mL of vaccine intramuscularly in the thigh or breast muscle or subcutaneously in the lower part of the neck. Use the entire contents of a bottle within 3 hours.
Withholding Period	NIL
Presentation	Bottles containing 500 mL of vaccine sufficient for 1000 doses.
Storage	Store between 2°C and 8°C (Refrigerate. DO NOT FREEZE).
Restraints	Do Not mix with other vaccines
Disposal	Dispose of empty containers by wrapping with paper and putting in garbage. Discarded needles/sharps should be placed in a designated and appropriately labelled 'sharps' container.
Safety Instructions	Should a vaccinator by accident inject him/herself or a bystander, a local reaction may occur. It is recommended the advice of a doctor is sought, that the doctor be advised that the vaccine is in oil emulsion and that this leaflet or a Safety Data Sheet be shown to the doctor.
